

PARK RULES

1 Adhere to Park entry and exit times. Unless you are an overnight visitor, always exit the park before dusk. Park gates open at 6:00 am and close at 6:00 pm.

2 General rules of the road apply. Car hooting and driving under the influence of alcohol is strictly prohibited.

3 Move slowly and quietly but remember all animals are wild and can react dangerously if startled.

At present, Mt. Longonot N. Park is not included in the KWS Safari Card system and therefore, mode of payment includes;



INTRODUCTION

Derived from the Maasai word Oloonong'ot meaning mountains of many spurs and ridges, Mt. Longonot N. Park covers an area of 52sq km, most of it being occupied by the mountain. A young volcano rises to about 2,776 meters above sea level.

The flanks of the mountain have beautiful V-shaped valleys and ridges while the stony soils have little vegetation but the crater has an impenetrable forest. Due to the nature of the terrain, Mt. Longonot has no roads and visitors hike to the top and rim of the crater.



KEY ATTRACTIONS & ACTIVITIES

The extinct volcano and crater forest, and the serene scenic landscapes with views of Lake Naivasha and the Great Rift Valley are most definitely one of the great visitor pullers to this destination. A unique feature is the thick forest that lies within the crater of this volcanic mountain.



Major wildlife attractions at Mount Longonot include buffaloes, elands, lion, leopard, bushbucks, common zebra, giraffe and Grant's gazelles. The park is also a paradise for birds of prey.

ACCOMMODATION

Stay in the Wild, explore, create memories

While Mt. Longonot National Park doesn't offer any accommodation options, visitors keen on staying overnight after a hike up the mountain can opt to go all out and indulge in a camping spree.

CAMPING: PUBLIC CAMPSITE

• OLOONGONOT CAMPSITE

For this category standard amenities are provided; water, toilet/bathroom and kitchen area. Public campsites do not require prior booking.

SPECIAL CAMPSITES (BOTH INSIDE THE CRATER)

- NYATI CAMPSITE
- GREEN CAMPSITE

For this category, only camping grounds are provided. The visitor has to reserve the special campsite well in advance for exclusive use. Visitors have to bring with them personal effects, drinking water, source of fire and kitchen utensils.

* Prevailing camping rates apply per person per day for both special and public campsites including other park charges.
