PARK RULES

Adhere to Park entry and exit times. Unless you are an overnight visitor, always exit the park before dusk. Park gates open at 6:00 am and close at 6:00 pm.



General rules of the road apply. Car hooting and driving under the influence of alcohol is strictly prohibited.



Move slowly and quietly but remember all animals are wild and can react dangerously if startled.

Also important are; Camera, binoculars, sunscreen, insect repellant, first aid kit, sunglasses, appropriate hiking and reserve car fuel if




HOW TO GET THERE

INTRODUCTION

Fundamentally undiscovered, pristine and undisturbed, Mwea National Reserve is an oasis of calm and tranquility in a populous landscape. Boldly painted on a parchment canvas of dusty dry bush and feathered acacia, this diverse pocket of wilderness is traversed by torrential seasonal rivers and stubbed with bulbous baobab trees.

The ecosystem's main features are the meeting point of rivers Tana and Thiba, Kamburu and Masinga hydro-electric dams, which harbor a variety of biodiversity.

The reserve is renowned for its water for birds and waders and shelters two other rare species; Pel's fishing owl and the white-backed night heron. It is the only protected Reserve in which the globally threatened and Kenya-endemic Hinde's Babber is found.

key attractions & ACTIVITES

Rarely visited, Mwea National Reserve has great rewards for those in search of peace, calm and tranquility. If you value solitude and reflection, delight in soaking your senses in sights and sounds that nature gives freely. Mwea excels in tranquil wildlife and birdlife where over 200 species have been recorded.

The Kamburu water reservoir harnesses the combined waters of the Tana and Thiba rivers and features two small islands. The waters boast of a healthy hippopotamus population.

ACCOMMODATION

Stay in the Wild, explore, create memories

The park doesn't offer KWS self-catering accommodation options however, visitors keen on staying overnight can camp.

For this category, only camping grounds are provided. The visitor has to reserve the special campsite well in advance for exclusive use. Visitors have to bring with them personal effects, clean drinking water, source of fire and kitchen utensils.
